You are invited to apply or be nominated for a **Youth in Service – Moving Saskatchewan Towards Reconciliation Youth Conference**. This is a two-day youth empowerment conference open to Indigenous and non-Indigenous youth ages 15 - 22, from across Saskatchewan.

The Office of the Treaty Commissioner is hosting two youth conferences, one in the North and one in the South. We will have motivational guest speakers, round table discussions, empowerment sessions, group and individual activities and more.

At the end of the two conferences, 36 youth will be selected to continue working and travelling with the OTC in the following capacities:

- 20 Indigenous and non-Indigenous youth will form a Youth Advisory Council;
- 10 Indigenous and non-Indigenous youth will join the OTC's Youth Speaker's Bureau;
- 6 Indigenous and non-Indigenous youth will form a Youth with Youth Cadre
